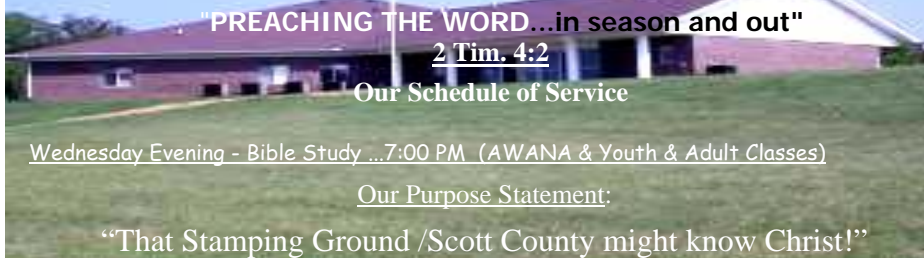

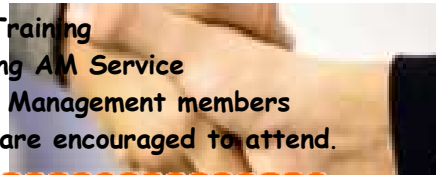

The Story of the Good Shepherd

The story of the Good Shepherd is not the tragic story of a victim but the tremendous story of a victor - one who secured His victory by voluntarily laying His life down on our behalf.

Pilate tried to intimidate Jesus with the authority to release Him or crucify Him (John 19:10) Peter tried to protect Him with his sword at Gethsemane (Matt. 26:51). But Jesus death was voluntary. He told Peter, "put your sword back into its place. . . or do you think that I cannot appeal to my Father, and He will at once put at My disposal more than twelve legions of angels?" (Matt. 26:52-53). And to Pilate, Jesus replied, "you would have no authority over Me, unless it had been given from above" (John 18:11).

No, Jesus did not become entrapped in some sticky political web from which He could not extricate Himself. Rather, He spun a story of selfless sacrifice so enticing, so enchanting that it would attract people to Him for millennia to come.

And we, those "other sheep" have come into the fold because that two-thousand-year-old story stirred us like nothing else - that story of a shepherd so supremely good that nothing stood in the way of His love for His sheep. Not even His own life.
